### heartleaf arnica *Arnica cordifolia*\* (P)

Large yellow daisy-like flowers framed by two opposite, soft, heart-shaped leaves. Excellent ground cover for partially shaded locations. 8-12" tall. The most medicinal native species of arnica.

### arrowleaf balsamroot *Balsamorhiza sagittata* (P)

The true harbinger of spring in the sagebrush foothills and mountains of the West! Yellow, 2-3" flowers, framed by light-green, large leaves shaped like arrowheads.

### baby's breath *Gypsophila paniculata* (P)

Thousands of small, lacy, white flowers cover globus sage-green shrubs. Hang upside down in a cool, dry location to preserve this flower shop favorite. Single plants can measure 3' in diameter.

wild delphinium *Delphinium occidentale*\* (P)

wild geranium *Geranium viscosissimum*\* (P)

This is our wild geranium. Oceans of pale-pink, delicate petals with deep-pink veins. Deep-green leaves turn orange and red as summer wears on. The flower petals are edible. 1-3' tall.
